

On December 18, 2002, NCFM-LA chapter president and attorney Marc Angelucci was part of a four-person panel on the Phil Donahue Show, along with Warren Farrell, Gloria Allred, and the editor of Stuff Magazine. The show was called "Are women getting a free ride?" Also appearing and speaking out (from the audience) were NCFM-NY chapter president Peter Allemano, various male victims of government anti-male discrimination in family court and welfare, and also the quarterback and two other members of a high school football team from Queens, New York, who recently had their entire team cut from the school's budget in order to equalize gender participation between boys and girls in high school sports. A number of important issues were raised including family court bias, the public neglect and frequency of male victims of domestic violence, the government's neglect of prostate cancer funding (especially compared to breast cancer funding) and overall neglect of men's health issues, and other forms of anti-male discrimination in public policies. Men's activists also had the opportunity to refute the "pay gap" myth and to point out a number of double standards that men face.

NCFM was mentioned several times on the show, and NCFM-LA is generally pleased with the outcome.
